

International Christian College Costs of Study Europe & Non-Visa BA, BA (Hons), CertHE or DipHE Theology

Basic costs

The following is the estimated cost for **one person** for **one year** of study at the College including 9 months of accommodation and living expenses. On top of this, there will *either* be an extra 3 months of accommodation and living expenses *or* a return flight home and living costs at home.

Please also remember to allow for a return airfare each year.

The accommodation is either in single rooms or shared rooms, both with en suite facilities. The accommodation cost includes gas and electricity charges, but excludes food and laundry.

On top of the above, there is an annual programme registration fee with the University of Aberdeen of approximately £142, payable at the start of each year.

The costs of living above assume a 'reasonably restrained' lifestyle. Our experience is that many students from Europe wish to travel, take advantage of Glasgow entertainment opportunities etc, and may therefore require an extra £1,500 (approx.) on top of the stated costs.

It may be that you are eligible for grant/funding from your own Government agencies; you will need to make enquiries in your own country about this.

Accompanied by family

College policy is that we strongly recommend that overseas students do not bring their families with them. However, if your spouse and no children accompany you, then the costs increase by approximately £400 per month. If you come with children, then approximately £250 per month should be added for the first child and £150 per month for each extra child. Couples or families with children will need to rent accommodation in Glasgow. We have a list of possible accommodation that you may find useful.

The summer vacation

The programme runs from the beginning of September to June (with a graduation service during June in your last year). This allows you a choice as to what you do over the summer:

1. Return home. In this case you will need to purchase a return ticket home and cover any living costs at home. If you are not living in the College's own accommodation, you may have to pay for accommodation over the summer even if you are not using it.
2. Stay at college. In this case, it will cost you around £1500 per person (£500 per month) to cover accommodation and living expenses.

Prices apply to 2011/12 and may increase in subsequent years.
